

St. Margaret's Prayer Circle



The Atlanta Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Women celebrated their 68th Annual Convention the weekend of September 20-22, 2024 at the campus of St. Andrew Catholic Church in Roswell, Georgia. The AACCW chose "Loving in the Goodness of God" as their theme this year and to put in Archbishop Hartmayer's own words, " beautifully aligned with the Eucharistic Revival that is currently being promoted throughout the United States."

Pamela Tennell, President, and her board organized a weekend filled with engaging guest speakers, interesting workshops, masses, meetings, catered meals and fun for friends, both old and new, to spend time together and grow deeper in their awareness of their love for God. I wish I had the time to share every detail, but that would take a bit more than just this brief overview. However, as I sat in on one workshop titled, "Resource Awareness/Self-Care", I became mesmerized by the speaker's story. Her story sounded all too familiar. Why? Acceptable Items: Toys – cars, trucks, craft kits, dolls, small balls, small plush animals, legos School Supplies – erasers, glue sticks, colored pencils, pencil sharpeners, markers Clothing – dresses, flip-flops, plastic ponchos, socks, t-shirts, shorts, underwear Toiletries – bandages, bar soap, brush, hand wipes, lip balm, toothbrush and toothpaste

Prohibited Items: Liquid items, food, beverage, chocolate or Jolly Ranchers, medicine, glass items, knives, toy weapons, cash, check, or gift cards
